Amtrak passengers arrive by bus

About 80 Seattle-bound Amtrak passengers were bused to the King Street Station yesterday because a Milwaukee Road freight-train derailment in Bellingham interfered with Amtrak's regular Vancouver, B.C.-Seattle service.

Don Petersen, Milwaukee Road's chief dispatcher, said three freight cars jumped the track about 3:35 a.m. today at the freight yard in Bellingham.

The cause of the derailment was not known, he said.

Amtrak's Train 793 from Vancouver, B.C. to Seattle was canceled. Passengers from Amtrak points between the two cities arrived here shortly after 10 a.m. via a Canadian charter-bus service.
